Corvallis Community Church was founded on April 5, 1885 by Reverend Fisher and Reverend Ellis. It was originally called the First Presbyterian Church of Corvallis. The name was changed in 1915 to the Corvallis United Church. This name change was due to the Baptist, Presbyterian, Christian and Methodist churches joining together. They used the Corvallis building and each had two men represent them for a total of eight board members. At the time the only towns in the area were Corvallis, Stevensville, Darby, and Como. This church was the only Protestant church South of Stevensville. On its first Sunday as the United Church it had an attendance of 172 people in 1915. The name was changed to Corvallis Community Church in 1945 with the adoption of the constitution still used today.

Now

Corvallis Community Church meets every Sunday at 8:30 and 10:00 a.m. with Sunday school at 9:30 a.m. They also have a Youth Group for 7th-12th graders, which meets every Wednesday night at 6:15 p.m. The present pastor is Matt Leopold. He has been with the church for three years. The church has a board as well as Elders and Deacons. They decided what goes on in the church with different people assigned to different posts within the church. They have annual board meetings and semi-annual meetings to determine if a revision to the constitution is needed. The board manages expenses, maintenance, repairs, and wages among other duties.
